Ex-Eagles Striker Nets In Premier League

Former Arnold Town striker Ben Hutchinson scored his first Premier League goal at the City of Manchester Stadium on the 7th of October.

Hutchinson was an unused sub in a recent Cup tie at Spurs, but the striker finally made his debut against Manchester City after impressing in the reserve team this season.

Hutchinson left Gedling Road on transfer-deadline day in January 2006, joining Middlesbrough in a deal which could eventually net Arnold £100,000.

He was given his debut after 59 minutes, replacing another debutant, Tom Craddock.

His moment of glory came in the 89th minute when he snapped up a rebound.

Shiners Bolster Strike Force

South Normanton Athletic have signed two new strikers as they look to bolster their attack for the long season ahead.

The Shiners have signed former Belper Town player Nathan Scott and Derby County trainee Karl Ashton on a game-by-game basis to cover for long-term injuries and the sale of Valadamir Santos Farrell to Carlton Town.

Joint manager Mark Harvey said: "Nathan Scott has some pedigree and I have been impressed by what I have seen.

"Karl has a lot of pedigree and we are expecting him to stamp his authority and score goals for us.

"This is a new line-up up front for us but we hope they will work well together and form a good partnership.

"Ashton is hoping to get back into professional football and we know that he may leave if he scores a lot of goals for us.

"Even if he helps us win just a few games then it will be a good signing for us."

Scarborough Set For Homecoming

Scarborough's football club could return to the town as early as next season under ground-breaking plans to expand Sheffield United's youth set-up.

The former Football League outfit were consigned to history in June after being wound up amid crippling debts of £2.5m.

Scarborough folded after the board and the local council failed to agree terms on lifting restrictions preventing the sale of the McCain Stadium to house-builders. The old club had wanted to sell the site to clear their considerable debts.

A new club, Scarborough Athletic, was set up within days by the Seadog Supporters Trust and entered the Northern Counties East League.

However, due to ownership of the McCain Stadium having passed to liquidators Begbies Traynor, the fledgling club were forced to move out of town and play their home games at Bridlington Town's Queensgate ground.

Under plans drawn up by Sheffield United, who took over the Seadogs' school of excellence when the old club folded, that nomadic existence could be over as early as next summer.

The Blades have been in talks with George Pindar Community Sports College about a partnership that would see the school of excellence extended and a new Conference-standard stadium built on land next to the College's Eastfield site.

Athletic would then be invited to play at the new stadium, which if everything goes to plan could be open as early as the 2009-10 season.

The McCain Stadium, which the council plans to buy from the liquidator, is understood to be a key part of the plans with Athletic possibly making a temporary return to their former home in time for next season.

Eagle Valley Work Begins

Meanwhile, work has finally begun at the site of a proposed new ground for NCEL Premier Division side Arnold Town.

After being given the green light following years of waiting for the go-ahead, the first stage of building Eagle Valley involved stripping the top soil and levelling the site.

The sight of seeing the machinery moving in earlier this month will be of huge relief to Arnold Town supporters.

The move to the new facility was in doubt until it was confirmed in August that they would receive £1.4m worth of funding, mostly from the Football Foundation.

The club are aiming to start playing at the new ground from next August.

MATCH REVIEW

Liversedge are seventh after Nicky Boshell and Matthew Sparks helped claim a 2-1 win at Selby Town after Tom Matthews had put the Robins ahead.

And a Matthew Hallam goal plus a Matthew McCaul penalty saw Long Eaton United win 2-0 at Mickleover Sports.

Meanwhile, Teversal moved up to second with a 3-3 draw at Staveley Miners Welfare who also climbed upwards to fourth.

Gedling Town were the first side to book their place in the last four of the Wilkinson Sword Trophy as they won 3-2 at home to Barton Town Old Boys with a last-gasp winner.

And, in the County Cups, Winterton Rangers began the game with ten men at Lincoln Moorlands Railway due to traffic problems but they still managed a comfortable 4-0 victory to go into the Quarter-Finals.

Two from Rob Northen and one each from Andy Catton and Danny Clarke booked a place in the last eight at Barton.

Rainworth Miners Welfare bowed out of the Notts Senior Cup at the First Round stage as they were beaten 3-2 on penalties by visitors Southwell City.

Rudy Funk's side looked to be going through in ninety minutes through Sam Betts and Barry Allberry but Lee Smith levelled in injury time to force an extra half-hour and then the shoot-out.

In the Sheffield & Hallamshire Senior Cup, Lee Holmes, Ian Hemingway and Rob Oxer notched up a 3-0 home win for Rossington Main over Mexborough Main Street.

A strike from Louis Axcell halfway through the second period saw Dinnington Town progress by a single goal victory at home to Yorkshire Main.

And, Brodsworth Welfare completed the triple success with a 2-1 home win over Armthorpe Miners Welfare.

The FA Cup campaign has ended as all the remaining NCEL sides fell at the Third Round Qualifying stage.

Dinnington Town were reduced to nine men as they fell to a 7-1 defeat at home to Bradford Park Avenue, Simon Mirfin's 77th-minute strike the only ray of sunshine on a disappointing day.

Rainworth Miners Welfare also had a player see red as they were beaten 2-0 at Chasetown and Glapwell were on the wrong end of a 3-0 scoreline at home to Corby Town.

Winterton Rangers have closed Premier Division leaders Nostell Miners Welfare's gap at the top to two points after a 5-1

win at South Normanton Athletic.

An Andy Holt brace plus one each from Andy Catton, Matthew Plant and Steve Underwood claimed the easy victory, Adam Newton grabbed the consolation for the Shiners.

And, Stephen Rock's 87th-minute winner kept Armthorpe Welfare in third place after a hard-fought 3-2 win at home to Brodsworth Welfare.

Pickering Town are one of three sides to climb into the top six.

They moved into fourth after a 2-1 win at Hallam, ahead of Liversedge who won 2-0 at Eccleshill United and Arnold Town, who claimed a single-goal victory at Shirebrook Town with a 74th-minute goal from Chris Burton.

The leaders at the start of play, Barton Town Old Boys, were beaten 2-1 at home to Tadcaster Albion who are now fourth.

Ryan Pleasants scored with six minutes remaining as Worsbrough Bridge won 1-0 against visitors Staveley Miners Welfare.

AFC Emley and Rossington Main shared six goals in what seems to have been a thriller whilst Leeds Met Carnegie showed they're getting their season on track with a 3-0 win at Borrowash Victoria.

And, Hall Road Rangers were 4-1 victors at home to Yorkshire Amateur.

Meanwhile, Scarborough Athletic moved through to the Second Preliminary Round of the North Riding Senior Cup with a 2-0 win at Kirkbymoorside.
