'Grog' Steps Down As Shirebrook Boss

NCEL Premier Division side Shirebrook Town have announced that manager Graham Charlesworth has left his post.

In a statement the Langwith Road outfit said: "With regret and mutual consent, Graham has been removed from his duties as first team manager with immediate effect.

"All at the club wish to thank him for all he has done for the club over many years.

"It is hoped that he will continue to be involved in the club in the future.

"A further statement will be issued in due course."

Gedling Management Duo Go To UniBond

NCEL Division One highflyers Gedling Town have appointed John Humphries as caretaker boss after Lee Wilson and Jimmy Albans moved to Shepshed Dynamo.

After rumours on various messageboards including the Unofficial NCEL Forum, the UniBond side announced the appointment on their website last Tuesday.

It follows the departure of Martin Rowe from the Leicestershire outfit at the beginning of the month.

There had been speculation that Wilson may have been frustrated by lack of money for players at the Riverside Ground.

But, Gedling Town chairman Roland Ash said: "The reason given by Lee was the challenge to manage at a higher level - that was the only reason and no other.

"However, we are very disappointed after both managers did agree, when appointed, that they would be here till the end of season and beyond.

"It is that part of the whole episode that has hurt the directors and committee but we have agreed with Lee that there will be no mud-slinging by either side and agreements have been reached.

"We bear no malice to him and wish him personally the very best in his footballing time.

"Naturally, we are disappointed he has gone but do wish him well as he has conducted himself correctly."

Gedling wasted no time in bringing Humphries in, initially in a caretaker role but with a view to making the move permanent in the future.

His first game in charge saw his side move back to the top of Division One with a 2-0 win at home to Yorkshire Amateur.

Broddy Turn To Turner

Brodsworth Welfare boss Richard Sennett has added to the club's pitchside team as they bid to move off the bottom of the Premier Division.

MATCH REVIEW

(Round 30 – Tue 20th Nov to Wed 21st Nov)

Pickering Town will go to fellow NCEL side Winterton Rangers in the Third Round of the FA Vase after a last-minute winner in a midweek replay.

Ricky Greening sealed his hat-trick in stoppage time to claim a 3-2 victory at home to another NCEL outfit, Eccleshill United.

Liversedge moved to the top of the Premier Division, meanwhile, with a 4-1 victory at home to Parkgate.

The visitors opened the scoring on 28 minutes through Steve Ward before Sedge levelled through Damien Melvin before Chris Woods, Nicky Boshell and Luke Sherman claimed the three points in the second half.

Winterton Rangers climbed to third with a 3-0 victory over their visitors and former league leaders, Nostell Miners Welfare.

Danny Clarke, Steve Underwood and Lee Mohammed all struck in the opening fifteen minutes.

Hallam are tenth after their 3-1 win at Armthorpe Welfare whilst, in the only game in Division One, Dinnington Town ran out comfortable 5-2 winners at home to Rainworth Miners Welfare.

Goals from Simon Mirfin, Ant Lynam, Michael Blythen and new signing Grant Allott had them four-up by the break before Allott got his second and Dinnington's fifth on 63 minutes.

With two games postponed in the Second Round of the Derbyshire Senior Cup, Glapwell were the only NCEL side to progress in the competition in midweek.

But, it took a Matt Varley penalty in the 89th minute to seal the 3-2 victory at home to Mickleover Sports.

It was the same scoreline at the Euronics Ground as Barton Town Old Boys climbed to third with a point at home to Borrowash Victoria.

They replaced Scarborough Athletic who were beaten 2-0 by visitors Leeds Met Carnegie through second-half goals from Paul Harrison and Alex O'Brien.

Tadcaster Albion were the day's biggest winners with a 4-1 victory at home to Hall Road Rangers to climb into eighth.
