Dring Steps Down As Main Boss

Ian Dring has quit as manager of NCEL Division One basement side Rossington Main.

A club statement to the NCEL Website said: "On Wednesday 19th December 2007, manager Ian Dring offered his resignation which the Committee of Rossington Main accepted.

"His decision comes after a number of players contacted him to say that they couldn't make training that night.

"This was not the first instance of this happening, and, coupled with the results over the last twelve months, Ian felt that it was time to put an end to his tenure as manager of the first team.

"The club have been swift in finding a replacement with the appointment of Ian Wilson, a well known and popular former manager and player of the club who is respected both on and off the pitch in the local community.

"He will be ably assisted by former Retford United defender, Rob Burton, with a view to turning the club's fortunes around.

"It is hoped that the players that have been loyal to the club this season will continue."

Moorlands Launch Fund-Raising Project

Lincoln Moorlands Railway have begun a massive drive to raise cash for new changing rooms.

It started with last week's friendly with near-neighbours Boston United that Moorlands won 2-1.

Currently, the club have been using portable facilities that were intended to be used for five years but have been up for closer to fifteen.

The club were promoted to Premier Division for this season on the understanding that new facilities would be built.

Secretary Graham Peck said: "When we merged with the Railway Club they brought with them nine junior and girls teams who use the pitch recently developed next to the main ground.

"However, when a senior team is playing it means the junior teams have no changing facilities which is not very pleasant.

"We have about 70 per cent of the cost waiting for us at the Football Foundation but we need to raise something like £20,000 in a fairly short time."

Moorlands are launching a 'Buy a Brick' project which will be £10 for an individual or £25 for a business to buy a brick that will be acknowledged on the club's website and in match programmes.

During the summer there will also be an outside music concert and, hopefully, a sportsman's dinner and friendlies.

Meanwhile, the club have been rocked by the retirement of central defender Mark Hone.

It comes after a season disrupted by injury and suspension and the player facing a nine game ban at Christmas.

Hone played at Lincoln City before joining Spalding United and then coming to Moorlands.

Club Secretary Graham Peck said: "What an unfortunate way to end a career but Mark has taken great pride in his son, Daniel, playing professionally for Lincoln City and wants to support him and that is understandable.

"I have met some nice people in football and in the short time he has been here everyone has thought what a nice bloke he is.

"He hopes to be still involved and train with us and Moorlands wish him well for the future."

Williams Forced To Retire

"He played a controlling central midfield role for us and was a major factor in our promotion to the Northern Counties East League two years ago.

"His encouragement to the younger players was invaluable and his dressing room humour will be sorely missed."

Shirebrook Town were also home winners, 2-1, against Long Eaton United.

Gedling Town's lead at the top of Division One stretched to three points with a 2-0 win at Leeds Met Carnegie thanks to goals from Tim Wilks and Phil Massingham.

Bottesford Town moved up into second as John Baross and Phil Jackman also earned them a 2-0 victory, this time at home to Tadcaster Albion.

Barton Town Old Boys remained fourth despite being held to a 1-1 draw at home to Hall Road Rangers.

Rainworth Miners Welfare picked up a 2-0 victory at Pontefract Collieries whilst Ryan Damms' 66th minute strike claimed a 1-0 win at home for Staveley Miners Welfare against Yorkshire Amateur.

MATCH REVIEW

(Round 36 – Tue 11th Dec to Wed 12th Dec)

Armthorpe Welfare booked their place in the Final of the NCEL Presidents Cup with an extra-time victory at home to Selby Town on Tuesday.

It had been a fine start to the evening for the Robins after Steve Lyon had given the visitors the lead with just seven minutes gone.

But, Stuart Preston levelled before the half-hour and, with no further scoring in normal time, an extra thirty minutes were needed.

Paul Ashton put Welfare ahead towards the end of the first period of extra time and Liam Radford ensured victory with virtually the last kick of the game to give Armthorpe a 3-1 win.

The other semi-final between Winterton Rangers and Liversedge will need to be rescheduled after it was postponed on Wednesday due to an unplayable pitch at West Street.

An Andy Sunley strike ten minutes from time proved to be only a consolation for Tadcaster Albion as they bowed out of the West Riding County Cup at the Second Round stage.

They were beaten 3-1 by UniBond hosts Harrogate Railway who had earlier sailed into a comfortable lead with goals from James McDaid, Scott Ryan and Richard Marshall.

In Division One, Dinnington Town moved up to second and a point behind leaders Gedling Town after a 3-0 home win over Bottesford Town.

Ant Lynam opened the scoring in the opening five minutes but it was not until the last ten before they put the game beyond doubt with goals from Martin Wade and Grant Allot.

Glapwell's Premier Division clash at home to Eccleshill United, meanwhile, was called off due to a frozen pitch.

Liam Radford then halved the deficit for Welfare in the opening minute of the second period.

Mark Clarke added a third for the Eagles and Bonnick completed his hat-trick on 75 to give them a 4-1 lead.

Welfare once again came back into it with a brace from Nathan Iley, one a penalty, in the last three minutes but Arnold held on for the win.

Armthorpe dropped to sixth as a result of that defeat and were replaced in fifth by Selby Town who won 2-0 at Parkgate.

Bruno Holden and Steve Lyon got the goals, one in each half, to claim the points for the Robins.

And, in Division One, Bottesford Town moved up into fifth by winning the only game that took place.

A twelfth-minute opener from Craig Mitchell was added to by Kev Larkin on 37 for a 2-0 win in an uninspiring match at home to Staveley Miners Welfare.
