Clubs Reminded Of Postponement Procedure

The Management Board of the Northern Counties East League are concerned to be receiving notification from clubs of fixtures being postponed in advance of the day of the game.

The League competition rules are quite specific that games can only be called off on the day of the game after a pitch inspection by an appropriate qualified match official.

Any deviation from this policy MUST be sought from either the League secretary or the Fixtures Secretary before postponing the fixture and all notification of any postponement should be in accordance with rule 15.2 of the competition rules.

Quartet Apply For UniBond

Four NCEL Premier Division teams have applied to move up the National League System.

Armthorpe Welfare, Glapwell, Pickering Town and Selby Town will now be vying for what looks likely to be one promotion place into the UniBond League.

Clubs were given until December 31st to make their intentions known to the FA and the League.

Points Deduction For Seadogs

A six-point deduction for Scarborough Athletic has been confirmed following an FA hearing.

The Division One club had appealed against the League's ruling after it was discovered that Joe Lightowler, Darren Phillips and Craig Hogg played for them whilst suspended towards the start of the season.

In their defence at West Riding FA's headquarters in Woodlesford on January 8th, the Seadogs said they'd "exercised reasonable endeavours" to make sure that the players were eligible and that, in one case, the player was not told of his suspension as his previous club had disbanded.

A three-man FA panel decided that, although certain problems within the player registration system had been highlighted, they would uphold the League's original ruling of a points deduction and £300 fine.

Scarborough Athletic will also have to meet the costs of the hearing.

There was more bad news for the Seadogs when they learned that one of their players had been jailed for four months for breaching a supervision order.

The Scarborough Evening News reported that 25-year-old midfielder Gary Hepples was given the jail sentence when he appeared before Scarborough Magistrates' Court.

He was handed the 12-month order in September last year but he was accused of breaching the order, which involved carrying out community work, on two occasions.

One breach was said to have happened on November 15th last year and the other was on December 1st – the day when he was playing for the Seadogs at Staveley Miners Welfare in a 3-0 win.

He had been due to appear in court in December but that hearing was adjourned to earlier this month for him to appear in person.

Boss Brian France has told the Non-League Paper that Hepples will be given the chance to continue his Seadogs career upon his release.

Meanwhile, the club have signed 19-year-old winger Ryan Morton from Frickley Athletic.

He had been on loan at Pontefract Collieries this season, but found opportunities limited so has decided to join Scarborough.

He is described as "a left-winger with an eye for goal" and had scored for Frickley earlier in the season against Colwyn Bay in an FA Trophy tie as well as two other goals in friendly games.

He becomes the third player to join Boro this season who has also played for Frickley. Carl Wood and Richard Medcalf have also represented the Unibond League side.

Finally, following a survey conducted by Scarborough Athletic FC amongst its members, fans have decided overwhelmingly to keep the name of the club and the current design of its badge.

Welfare Act To Ease Relegation Fears

Glasshoughton Welfare have strengthened their management team after finding themselves cut adrift at the bottom of the Premier Division.

Following their heavy defeat at Selby on January 5th and the run of poor results recently plunging them deep into relegation problems, Glasshoughton have made the move to improve their situation.

Manager, Dave Holmes, has persuaded the ex number two at Bridlington Town, Ashley Berry, to come on board as his Assistant Manager.

Berry is on the Academy staff at Huddersfield Town and will bring a wealth of non-league experience and contacts into the club.

The club's new committee has managed to put the once ailing club on a much firmer financial footing and all the junior sections of the club are enjoying success.
