## Points Deduction For Two NCEL Clubs

**South Normanton Athletic and Barton Town Old Boys have both been deducted three points for fielding ineligible players.**

Dean Whiley played for South Normanton whilst suspended in their 4-2 NCEL Premier Division victory at home to Armthorpe Welfare on the 22nd of December.

Meanwhile, it was discovered that Barton Town had fielded two players in a Division One match who should have been sidelined through suspension.

Tom Lee and Matty McKay played in their 2-0 league win at home to Bottesford Town on the 1st of September.

Both clubs have accepted the League's ruling.

## Eagles Looking For A Ben Bonus

**Arnold Town hope to cash in on Ben Hutchinson's shock transfer to Celtic from Middlesborough.**

The 20-year-old striker, who came through the youth ranks at Gedling Road, was due to join the Scottish giants in the summer.

But the move to Celtic Park was rushed through just before the transfer deadline.

Neither club has released a fee but Arnold believe it was in the region of £250,000.

"We sold Ben to Middlesborough for £20,000 with a further £100,000 depending on appearances," said an Arnold spokesman.

"He made nine appearances. At the moment we are in conversation with Boro. Hopefully we will get something out of it."

## Friendly To Boost Tad Coffers

**Blue Square Premier outfit York City will hold their first pre-season friendly at Tadcaster Albion to help the club raise funds after recent flood damage.**

The game on Friday July 11th will offer City supporters the first chance to catch the 2008/2009 squad in action with all gate receipts going to the home team.

Tadcaster were forced to refurbish their club house after an arson attack before Christmas and, just as the work neared completion, heavy rainfall then saw the lngs Lane venue flooded.

The fire and water damage has also led to lost revenue while the clubhouse has been closed.

But, City's gesture, coupled with a £500 donation from supporters' group York Minstermen, should help the Northern Counties East League outfit recover from their recent traumas.

Tadcaster chairman Kevin Derry said: "It has been one thing after another and, when the River Wharfe decided to pay us a visit, it was the final straw really.

"The remarkable efforts of our members have just about put it right and we should open up again this weekend.

"Had we got professionals in, it would have cost us a few thousand pounds although it's still been far from easy financially and the clubhouse has been shut at a traditionally busy time of the year.

"It will be a difficult season and the gesture from York City is tremendous. It will be a big boost and help us get back on our feet as well as establish ourselves next season.

"York have had trouble themselves in the past so it is good of them to think of us in such times and respond in this way."

First-team boss Jimmy Reid agrees and believes the prestigious fixture will aid his recruitment drive over the closed season.

He said: "It will be great to have York City kick off our pre-season campaign and it is a gesture that shows their commitment and willingness to help out in the community."

City managing director Jason McGill added: "Colin Walker has promised to take a full squad to Tadcaster and, as a community football club, we feel it is important to assist other clubs in our area, especially in times of difficulty.

"The idea was presented to us by York Minstermen and we saw a pre-season friendly as the ideal way to help."

## Outram Leaves For Stocksbridge

**Parkgate midfielder Matt Outram has made the move up the National League System to play for Stocksbridge Park Steels.**

The UniBond Division One South side announced the news of boss Garry Marrow's third acquisition earlier this month.

But, when things didn't work out there, he went back to Green Lane, turning down a move to Park Steels at that time.

Barton had seemingly got the win in the bag as two from Gareth Barlow and one from Mark Anderson put them firmly in the driving seat.

But, Leeds Met, who were playing their seventh game in fifteen days, showed great resilience and goals from Joe Rossiter, Paul Harrison and James Elliott saw the match finish 3-3.

Scarborough Athletic moved up to ninth after a morale-boosting 3-1 win at home to Hall Road Rangers.

They had gone behind through a seventh-minute Paul Palmer strike but they got the victory with an excellent second-half display as Ryan Morton claimed the equaliser and Craig Hogg grabbed a brace.

Goals from Gavin Birmingham and Allan Laud earned AFC Emsley a 2-1 win at Worsbrough Bridge Athletic, a victory that moved them up to eleventh.

Richard Elson got the only goal of the game for Athletic.

**Winterton Rangers moved eleven points clear at the top of the Premier Division after a 3-0 win at Parkgate.**

Taking full advantage of second-placed Glapwell's postponed home game with Lincoln Moorlands Railway, Lee Mohammed gave Winterton a first-half lead before David Watson and Danny Clarke completed the victory.

Liversedge remained third as their title challenge took a stumble at Armthorpe Welfare, Craig Sugden's own goal on the hour mark giving the hosts a 1-0 victory.

But, fourth-placed Pickering Town kept their outside hopes alive with a 3-1 win at home to Shirebrook Town.

Hallam's charge up the Premier Division continued as they came from behind to beat visitors Maltby Main 4-1 and move up into fifth.

Liam Kay had given Maltby the ideal start after eighteen minutes before James Tevendale levelled matters before the break.

Andrew Wood then gave Hallam the lead in the opening minute of the second half before Tevendale grabbed his second and Brady Roberts completed the victory late on.

They climbed above Selby Town who were beaten 3-1 at home by an ever-improving Brodsworth Welfare.

Liam Wilkins, Sean Gorman and Liam O'Neill got the goals for the visitors to stretch their unbeaten run to six games during which time they moved from the bottom of the table to fourteenth.

The side currently in the wooden spoon spot, Glasshoughton Welfare, saw the gap between them and the rest grow despite picking up a good point in a goalless draw at Eccleshill United.

South Normanton Athletic remained in nineteenth but moved four points clear of Glasshoughton with a 2-1 win at home to Thackley.

And, Francis Johnson's 88th-minute strike grabbed Nostell Miners Welfare a point in a game that they had taken the lead in.

Dave Nicholas opened the scoring for them just after the hour mark before two goals in a minute from Adam Slater and Dave Middleditch had seemingly sealed the points for Mickleover Sports.

A seven-goal thrashing of visitors Yorkshire Amateur meant that Dinnington Town's lead at the top of Division One grew to twelve points.

Andrew Jones also got on the scoresheet for the visitors as the promotion chase continues to hot up.

Rainworth Miners Welfare lost a little ground with a 3-1 defeat at Scarborough Athletic.

A second-half brace from Richard Medcalf earned them revenge for a loss by the same scoreline in the reverse fixture seven days earlier.

Before that, Ryan Blott had cancelled out Robbie Clarke's first-half opener for the hosts.

Staveley Miners Welfare kept themselves in the promotion hunt as Ryan Damms' 28th-minute penalty moved them up to sixth with a single-goal victory at Barton Town Old Boys.

Pontefract Collieries were cast further adrift at the foot of Division One as they were beaten 1-0 at Tadcaster Albion.

Their nearest rivals, Rossington Main, continued their resurgence with a 3-2 win at Borrowwash Victoria.

Nathan Hill and Jason Stokes had them two-up within the opening seventeen minutes before a couple from Tommy Leighton brought the scores back level.

Andy Culshaw grabbed the winner with twenty minutes remaining.

And, Paul Harrison's strike five minutes from the end picked up a point for Leeds Met Carnegie in a 2-2 draw at Worsbrough Bridge Athletic.
