And, the club say that, "as several of the playing squad chose to follow Sean and leave the club, Robbie did exceptionally well to assemble a team to play at Nostell Miners Welfare the following Saturday."

The statement continued: "The club can only speculate as to why Sean's resignation sparked a mass exodus of players from the club.

"Robbie and the rest of the club committee would like to place on record their thanks to the players who have remained loyal to Maltby Main and who now figure strongly in Robbie's plans for the rest of the season.

"The club is, however, hopeful that squad members will return to the fold for this season's run-in."

Barron has appointed former Parkgate Reserves coach Wayne Grant as his assistant.

And, ex-Barnsley, Lincoln City, Doncaster Rovers, Scarborough and Stocksbridge Park Steels player, Sean Dunphy, is now club coach.

Eccleshill Pay Tribute To Stokes

He broke his collar bone during their single-goal victory in the NCEL Division One clash at Barton Town Old Boys and it now means he could be out for up to two months.

Two Fans Banned From Boro Matches

Scarborough Athletic have banned two supporters from attending matches.

The move follows crowd incidents in the NCEL games at home to Emley and away at Dinnington.

The suspensions will cover all home games and official club travel to away matches.

One of the fans has been banned until the end of the season, and the other for the next two months.

The decision was made in line with Boro's spectator behaviour policy created to give the club an official framework with which to deal with poor behaviour at Athletic matches.

The club received reports regarding the incidents against Emley and Dinnington, and studied video evidence to support the decision before imposing the bans.

A Boro spokesman said: "We would like to remind all our supporters that poor behaviour will not be tolerated at our matches and will be dealt with accordingly."

Meanwhile, nearly 450 signatures have been raised by Athletic in support of council efforts to retain the covenant on their previous club's former ground.

The Athletic Ground has been left deserted since Scarborough FC ceased to exist last summer.

The new club, Scarborough Athletic, are currently playing at Bridlington Town's Queensgate Stadium but supporters have already voiced their desire to return to their old ground.

With the future of the former McCain Stadium up in the air, fans have put their name to a petition backing the council's efforts to keep a sporting covenant in place on the site.

Boro's communications and marketing director, James Hunter, said: "We are delighted with the response from supporters and managed to get 446 names on the petition.

"It shows how passionate people are to see the club return to the town."

Shiners Open Disabled Stand

South Normanton Athletic Football Club have opened their new Wheelchair and Disabled Supporters Stand at Lees Lane.

Club Chairman Colin Price invited Janice Cooper from the South Normanton & Pinxton Development Project to officially open the stand and cut the ribbon on the 25th of February.

He added: "This was the idea of the Ground Development Officer and Life Member Peter Kane.

"Along with Janice, they successfully received a grant for part of the cost from The Big Lottery Fund 'Awards for All' Scheme."

The stand holds ten wheelchairs together with sixteen seats with extra leg room, together with 30 other seats for their carers.

This was the final project at Lees Lane carried out by their ageing but hard working committee over the past twelve months.

Amongst the other improvements made to the ground has been concrete hard standing for supporters as well as new pitch and ground perimeter fencing and refurbishments to their existing seated area.

The club have thanked Vice Chairman, Derek Miles, Committee Members Arthur Albrighton, Malcolm Cotton and local volunteer Geoff Allard who had worked tirelessly throughout last summer.

Mr Price concluded by saying: "The club is still looking for a consortium to take over its running.

"We do have everything in place at the ground, with a long lease, its own Social Club and excellent facilities.

"We renew our appeal to anyone with a serious interest in football to get in touch with us."
