Pikes UniBond Blow

Pickering Town's hopes of promotion to the UniBond League next season have come to an end, the club has said.

They were one of four NCEL Premier Division clubs to have applied to move up the National League System, along with Glapwell, Selby Town and Armthorpe Welfare.

But, they say they have now been told by the Football Association that their seating arrangement does not fit the relevant ground grading criteria.

They are required to have 150 covered seats within one stand but the Mill Lane ground has two stands, each with 100 seats in them.

The club, who say they do not have enough time to fix the problem, are to appeal the decision.

Dennis Leaves AFC Emley

AFC Emley have accepted the resignation of their manager, Ray Dennis.

Dennis, who had been at the helm of the club since it was formed three years ago, offered to go after the 6-0 home defeat to Parkgate in the Sheffield & Hallamshire Senior Cup earlier this month.

A club statement to the NCEL Website said: "At a hastily arranged Management Committee Meeting, with Ray in attendance, it was decided to accept his resignation and to ask Nicky Bramald and Daryl Brook to take over the Managers position at least until the end of the season.

"This will give everyone time to evaluate the situation and make considered judgements.

"Ray states that he made this decision because he felt he had gone as far as he could with the team and that the team seemed unable to play the way he wanted.

"He, therefore, felt that someone else should take the helm and see if the club could make the progress that he some much wanted.

"We are very pleased to announce that Ray will not be leaving the club.

"He will stay on the Management Committee of the Club as a working member.

"This club has been a part of Ray's life for so many years that we were extremely pleased that he is to stay on in a committee role.

"From the management's perspective we know and understand that the managers have had a very difficult role especially with very little money.

"Finances at clubs like ours are at a premium, which is why we need to get the clubhouse completed and opened so that we may be able to finance the football team instead of watching money being spent elsewhere.

"We anticipate that the clubhouse should be completed by the end of March and then we hope to take the development into Stage Two which will be to extend the dressing room area to include a Physio Room, Lady Officials changing room and extend the Away Dressing Room.

"Finally, we ask for everyone's support both to the players on the field and the Committee off it. We ask for your patience whilst we get things right both on and off the field."

Shuttleworth Names Backroom Staff

Shirebrook Town's new boss, Pete Shuttleworth, has announced his management team.

Mark Hall will be his assistant whilst Andy White has been named as Physio and First Team Coach.

Mark Hall enjoyed a fantastic playing career with Leicester City, Halifax Town, Oxford United and Kettering Town before experiencing non-league football with Denaby United and Belper Town.

He then took on scouting and coaching roles at Sheffield United, Yeovil Town and Mansfield Town before having a couple of years out of the game.

Shuttleworth said: "I am delighted to have Mark on board. He is a great footballing guy and has a fantastic pedigree in the game.

"We have worked really hard over the last two weeks to make this happen as Mark was in no rush to get back into football.

"I have sold the club to him and the potential that is here and Mark believes that we can do good things together.

"He is a highly qualified coach and he knows football inside out and his experience will be a massive benefit to this football club."

Andy White is a qualified physio and also a level 3 coach.

He has worked at the club before as joint manager of the 'A' team last year with Shuttleworth but has had some time away from the game with the birth of his new son.

Andy coaches at Chesterfield Centre of Excellence and coached most of the current playing squad while working at Chesterfield College.

Shuttleworth added: "Whitey is a good friend of mine and someone I can trust. When I spoke to him about getting involved I could see he was keen to get back into it.

Eagle Valley Building Starts Soon

Building work on Arnold Town's new £1.6m football ground is set to begin this month.

Landscaping and planning work has taken place over the winter months at the Eagle Valley site between Oxtou Road and the A614.

Club officials say the development is on schedule and that work to put up the clubhouse, offices and stadium for 3,000 supporters will start soon.

It will mean their 500 members and 31 teams will be able to start the 2008/09 season at their new home with 11 pitches.

Chairman Roy Francis told the Nottingham Evening Post: "All the grants are in place.

"The landscaping work is on time and progressing according to schedule.

"Everything is going to plan at the moment but we have had hold-ups in the past so we can't assume it won't happen again.

"But at the moment it is all going exceptionally well.

"The whole club will now be in one site - that is the main advantage."

The club's move came about after it was promised a combined £1.4m in grants from the Football Foundation, Sport England and a stadium improvement fund.

Seadogs Return Home Moves Closer

Scarborough Athletic fans have been given what could possibly be the best news yet in their attempt to return home.

The Seadogs currently play their football at Bridlington Town's Queensgate Stadium following their formation last Summer.

Board members of the club, along with Supporters Direct Acting Chief Executive Dave Boyle, met with Scarborough Borough Council officials on Tuesday to discuss the club's ambitions to play football within the town.

Head of Legal & Democratic Services, Ian Anderson, confirmed that the Council has lodged an official objection with the Lands Tribunal regarding an application to have the covenants protecting the Athletic Ground, also known as the McCain Stadium, removed.

A date has yet to be set by the Lands Tribunal for this case to be heard.

Leader of the Council, Tom Fox supported the idea of football returning to the town, saying: "We are keen to see that we have a sports facility that benefits the whole community, a facility that could support the town having, amongst other things, a football team that would have sustainable and realistic ambitions and popular support.

"Scarborough Athletic FC has popular support and, on the evidence of what I have seen, they are realistic in what they want to achieve.

"Securing the McCain Stadium is most important if we are to have the opportunity to provide those community facilities which could see a return of football to the town."

Club Chair Simon Cope welcomed the backing, adding: "We certainly appreciate the Council's desire to help us find a home in Scarborough, and look forward to working closely with them in the coming months, and indeed in the coming years.

"It is essential for the long term future of senior football in Scarborough that the correct, sustainable, solution is sought."

Pylon Fire Blackouts AFC Emley

AFC Emley's home match against Bottesford Town last Wednesday was abandoned when a floodlight pylon caught fire as a result of the week's storms.

Club secretary Richard Poulain told the Huddersfield Daily Examiner: "The wind and rain got into one of the pylons, causing a short circuit which resulted in all the lights going off.

"When we went to look at the problem pylon, we discovered the short had caused a fire inside so we had no option but to abandon the match and call the fire brigade."

But, Pickering Town stay the most serious threat to deny them the second place they may need to go up the National League System with the Pikes five points behind with two games in hand.

Pickering, who had in the week announced that they would not be able to meet ground grading requirements to progress themselves, won 1-0 at South Normanton Athletic.

Two goals from Craig Mitchell, one from the penalty spot, saw Arnold Town climb into fifth with their sixth straight league win after a 3-1 victory at home to Maltby Main.

Tian Walton sealed the win on 81 minutes after Main had pulled one back through Scott Somerville.

At the foot of the table, with bottom side Glasshoughton Welfare having a free weekend, the focus was on the other teams desperate to avoid the drop.

Four of the five sides in the fight with Welfare played but all came away pointless.

In addition to the losses for South Normanton and Maltby, Shirebrook Town were beaten 3-0 at Armthorpe Welfare whilst Thackley went down 3-1 at Mickleover Sports.

That meant that the gap between 15th and 19th place remained just

three points with Glasshoughton a further nine adrift.

Parkgate were comfortable 3-0 winners at home to Nostell Miners Welfare with goals from Steve Ward, Matt Outram and Caine Cheetham.

Long Eaton United won 2-0 at Eccleshill United whilst Selby Town and Hallam shared the spoils in a 2-2 draw.

Staveley dropped to sixth but remained in the midst of the dramatic battle for second place between seven teams going into the final weeks of the season.

Rainworth Miners Welfare moved up into second after a second-half brace from Sam Betts claimed a 2-0 home win over Rossington Main.

They moved above Gedling Town who were beaten 4-1 at Scarborough Athletic, a win that kept the Seadogs in touch of promotion on the rails in eighth place, six points behind Rainworth.

Mark Griffin and Ryan Blott had Scarborough two-up by the break before Blott extended the lead on 60 minutes.

Gedling pulled one back through Alan Jefferies before Scott Phillips ensured three vital points for the home side with five minutes remaining.

Leeds Met Carnegie climbed to fourth over their opponents Hall Road Rangers as Kev Ryan's solitary strike gave them the three points at Throstle Nest.

And, Phil Jackman's goal on 85 minutes to claim a 1-0 win for Bottesford at home to Yorkshire Amateur kept them in the promotion hunt in seventh place.

Teversal's slim hopes of going up may have gone after they drew 1-1 at Borrowwash Victoria, a Tom Land own goal getting them the point five minutes from time to cancel out a Jamie Pawley strike for the hosts.

At the bottom of Division One, Pontefract Collieries picked up a point at Worsbrough Bridge Athletic with a 2-2 draw to close the gap at the bottom to six behind Rossington.

AFC Emley won 4-2 at home to Tadcaster Albion whilst, in the Lincolnshire Senior Trophy, Winterton bowed out at the Semi-Final stage losing 1-0 at Blackstones.
