Dinnington Town Lift Division One Title

Dinnington Town have been crowned Division One champions after the weekend's 2-0 win at Worsbrough Bridge Athletic.

Knowing that they needed three points from any of their final six matches, they got what they needed with goals from Grant Allott and Ant Lynam.

The win put them thirteen points clear of their nearest rivals, Rainworth Miners Welfare, and their title triumph is greatly deserved after only being beaten once in the league all season.

Steve Toyne's side will be hoping to secure a double as they go for a place in the Final of the Sheffield & Hallamshire Senior Cup tomorrow night at home to Worksop Town.

That is followed by a trip on Sunday to Scarborough Athletic with a great number of Dinnington supporters expected to make the trip to the Queensgate Stadium to celebrate their Championship triumph.

Shirebrook Prepare For Relegation Fight

Shirebrook Town boss Pete Shuttleworth has made six new signings to his squad and there may be more to follow.

The Langwith Road outfit have bolstered their squad as they fight to stay in the NCEL Premier Division.

Joining the club are Dean Short from Teversal, Callum Wilkinson from Glapwell, Jonathan Jackson, Nathan Swindell and Adam Tyler from Lincoln United and Ady Hall from Forest Town.

36-year-old Dean is a centre forward who has previously played with Goole Town, Alfreton Town, Ashfield United and Sutton Town before joining Teversal at the start of the season.

He is well known in the local area as an all action centre-forward who has scored goals at every club he has been at.

Jonathan is a defender who has played in the UniBond Premier League whilst Nathan is a centre-forward who was previously with Gainsborough before joining Lincoln and Adam is a midfielder who has had previous experience with Staveley.

All three are joining on a one month loan arrangement with Lincoln United.

Callum is a young centre-forward who had impressed with their Under 19's before he was signed in January by Glapwell but found first team opportunities hard to come by.

Ady is an experienced player who has played at Glapwell, Alfreton and a number of local clubs before plying his trade at Forest Town

this season. He can play at centre half or in midfield.

Shuttleworth said: "There has been a lot of hard work behind the scenes to bring some new faces to the club and I am delighted that we are able to introduce a couple of new players.

"The last few results and performances have been unacceptable and the players have been made aware of that.

"There are also a few more players who we have the option of bringing in and it is now up to the current players to show they have got the desire and the ability to play for Shirebrook Town. Results have got to change quickly."

Leaving Langwith Road to make way for the new faces is Marc Sherlock who joined the club from Glapwell in November.

He will be remembered for his winning goal against his previous club on Boxing Day.

The manager added: "Unfortunately when you bring new faces to the club, some of the existing players have to make way and this was the case with Marc.

"He is a smashing lad and has a great attitude but, for one reason or another, things haven't worked out for him at Shirebrook.

"I wish him all the best in football."

Meanwhile, Mark Hall has been confirmed as General Manager of the club.

Mark came to the club as Assistant Manager a couple of weeks ago but it is thought he could have a greater impact in the General Manager's job.

His role will involve structuring the club so that the First Team, Reserves, Under 19's and Academy Team (next year) can work to their full potential and move forward.

Mark is also responsible for recruiting players.

Pete Shuttleworth will continue as First Team Manager and will be assisted by Andy White for the foreseeable future.

Boro Skipper Banned For Three Matches

Athletic moved up to sixth, six points behind second spot with a game in hand.

Hall Road Rangers are through to the Final of the East Riding Senior Cup after a Mike Carling brace gave them a 2-1 home win over Westella & Willerby AFC.

Dinnington Town claimed the Division One title whilst Winterton Rangers moved a step closer to winning the Premier Division crown in an exciting day's action in the Northern Counties East League.

Steve Toyne's side won 2-0 at Worsbrough Bridge Athletic to claim the three points they needed to take the Division One trophy.

In appalling conditions, they had to battle hard against their hosts and it was an edgy game until Grant Allott settled their nerves a minute before the interval.

Ant Lynam grabbed his fortieth goal of the season five minutes from time to send the visitors into wild celebration.

It has been a much deserved title win for Dinnington in their second season in the NCEL as they have lost only once all season, their fourth game of the campaign at Staveley Miners Welfare.

Winterton Rangers won 4-2 at home to Long Eaton United to move fifteen points clear at the helm of the Premier Division with seven games left to play.

A Josh Watson own goal after two minutes set them on their way before Andy Holt doubled their advantage on the hour mark.

Long Eaton, however, staged a remarkable comeback with two quick goals from Mark Strzyzewski drawing them level.

But, David Ricardo grabbed the third to regain the lead for Rangers and Holt made sure of the points in injury time.

They stretched their lead over second-placed Glapwell who were surprise 2-0 losers at home to Maltby Main.

Second-half strikes from Daniel Payne and Jovan Maric helped Main to three vital points in their survival battle.

The defeat cut Glapwell's lead over Liversedge to two points after Sedge, thanks to goals from Chris Woods and Brook Newton, won 2-1 at Lincoln Moorlands Railway.

Pickering's goalless draw at Mickleover Sports meant they were a further two points back in fourth.

Bottom side Glasshoughton Welfare were not in action but the side just above them, South Normanton Athletic, could not stretch the gap as they were beaten 2-1 at home to Selby Town.

Steve Lyon and Gary Collier struck in quick succession around the hour mark to condemn the Shiners although they pulled one back towards the end through Lee Sutton.

Maltby's win moved them into sixteenth, above Lincoln Moorlands and Thackley who were beaten 1-0 at Armthorpe Welfare by a Jammal Shahin goal in the 31st minute.

Shirebrook Town continued to have the threat of relegation tapping at their shoulder as they were beaten 5-1 at Parkgate to remain four points away from the bottom two.

It was a game that was, perhaps, less one-sided than the scoreline would suggest as Caine Cheetham claimed a nine-minute hat-trick late on in the match, with one of the goals coming from the penalty spot.

A James Tevendale brace earned Hallam a 2-0 victory at Arnold Town to keep them in fifth place.

And, a goal two minutes from time snatched a point for Eccleshill United at home to Brodsworth Welfare.

Chris Cookson got the vital strike after Ryan Malee had put the visitors ahead on 61 minutes.

With Dinnington Town miles away at the top of Division One, the chase for second place continued to hot up.

Rainworth Miners Welfare had two late Danny Naylor goals to thank for their victory at home to Staveley Miners Welfare that helped the gap grow between them and their nearest rivals to three points.

Third-placed Bottesford Town had to come from two goals down to draw 2-2 at home to Rossington Main.

William McGhie and Andrew Culshaw had put Main in command after 25 minutes before Phil Jackman and Craig Lill rescued a point.

Goals from Mike Gibson and Adam Walker kept Hall Road Rangers in the hunt as their 2-0 home victory over Tadcaster Albion kept them in fourth spot on goal difference.

Fifth-placed Gedling Town saw their challenge virtually ended with a 1-0 loss at Yorkshire Amateur as Daryl Brown grabbed the only goal of the game with five minutes remaining.

And, a late flurry of goals saw Scarborough Athletic held to a 2-2 draw at home to Teversal to all-but finish their chances.

Ryan Blott had put them ahead on 62 minutes before Marc Scott and Andy Woodcock turned the game in the visitors' favour.

But, a Scott Phillips penalty four minutes from time made it a draw – the eleventh draw that Teversal have notched up this season.

Borrowash Victoria were 2-1 winners at home to Barton Town Old Boys whilst Pontefract Collieries picked up a point in a 1-1 draw at AFC Emley.

It means he missed Boro's games against Borrowash Victoria and Teversal and he will also be out of Sunday's home tie with champions, Dinnington Town.

Club officials have conducted an internal inquiry with the player and have taken steps to ensure further disciplinary matters are adhered to.

Meanwhile, the Seadogs have been charged with misconduct by the North Riding FA following crowd disturbances at the match against AFC Emley.

The club were fined £150 plus costs at the hearing in Leeds for the incident which occurred at Queensgate.

One supporter was banned for the rest of the season following the incident.

The club has reissued a call for all supporters to adhere to the Supporters' Behaviour Policy to avoid any further incidents.

The policy is printed in the club's match day programme.

There was good news, meanwhile, with the signing of North Ferriby United midfielder Joel Hartley just days before the 31st March signing deadline.

The Humberside club agreed to waive the seven day notice period.

He played under Seadogs boss Brian France at Ferriby in successful times, having signed from Hall Road Rangers in 2003.

In five years at Ferriby in total he played 148 times, with 25 sub appearances, scoring 20 goals.

The 27-year-old skillful and pacey midfielder went straight into the squad for Boro's game against Teversal at the weekend.

Scarborough Athletic's Sport Relief Mile team braved the cold and put their best foot forward to raise over £850 for the charity earlier this month.

But, the club hope to raise even more cash.

Boro directors Simon Cope, Ben Courtney, Wendy Danby, Chris Rooke and Andy Troughton were joined by player Gary Hepples, website manager Steve Smith and young team mascot Bertie Courtney.

In a bitterly cold wind, the team strode on and completed the courses of either one or three miles, along with over 500 other competitors.

Hepples came third overall in the three mile competition, whilst the other team members clocked various times on both the one and three mile courses.

Chairman Cope said: "The amount raised so far has been fantastic, but it doesn't stop there and we'd like to hear from individuals or

businesses who can help lift us over our £1000 target."

MATCH REVIEW

(Round 65 – Mon 24th Mar to Wed 26th Mar)

Winterton Rangers booked their place in the Final of the NCEL League Cup in a dramatic penalty shoot-out on Easter Monday.

Ryan Johnson and Steve Ward then popped up with late goals to make sure of Parkgate's victory.

The only NCEL game without a goal came at the Flaxley Road Ground where Selby Town were held by Arnold Town.

Dinnington Town moved to within three points of the Division One title as they battled to a 2-1 win at Tadcaster Albion.

Only two sides – Hall Road Rangers and Bottesford Town – can stop them after an Ant Lynam penalty and a Ben Rosser winner put them within touching distance of the trophy.

They had to fight hard, though, against a resolute Tadcaster side who drew level through Michael Vickers early in the second period.

Rangers moved up into third with a 3-2 win at Staveley Miners Welfare who find themselves almost out of the chase for a top two spot after the defeat.

Staveley had gone ahead through Ryan Damms on eight minutes before Paul Palmer equalised almost immediately.

There was then a brief delay as home defender Chris Coy was taken to hospital with a dislocated shoulder.

Paul Palmer added his and Hall Road's second on 50 minutes and the third came from Jamie Barnwell near the hour mark.

Damms converted from the penalty spot with eight minutes remaining to make things tight but the visitors held on for three vital points.

They leapfrogged over Gedling Town who fell to a 4-3 defeat at Rossington Main with two penalties in the last thirteen minutes being their undoing.

Rossington had begun well with an eighth minute goal from Michael MacDonald and a second from Lee Holmes on 36.

But, Gedling fought back through Dennis Simms before the break and Barry Payne on 54 minutes.

They then took the lead from the penalty spot with just over a quarter-of-an-hour remaining.

However, the referee then pointed to the spot twice in Rossington's favour and Sean Greaves showed great calmness to convert them both to pick up three priceless points for Main at the wrong end of the table.

Bottesford kept their hopes of a top two spot alive with a 1-0 win at Worsbrough Bridge Athletic.

Paul Bell's 32nd minute goal moved them up into fifth place, four points behind second-placed Rainworth Miners Welfare.

And, Teversal were held to a 3-3 draw at home to AFC Emley.

They had gone behind to visitors Hallam thanks to a tenth minute Carl Smith strike before Rob Northen levelled matters just before the interval.

That is how it stayed through extra-time and Rangers made sure their attempt to win the Double was still on by winning 4-2 on spot kicks.

They will face either Barton Town Old Boys or Parkgate whose Semi-Final was called off due to an unplayable pitch – that match has been re-arranged for next Tuesday.

Meanwhile, in the Premier Division, Glapwell tightened their grip on second position with a 1-0 home win over Mickleover Sports.

On what was a tense evening, Jonathan Pickess broke the deadlock on 68 minutes.

The Hall Corner side's most likely rivals, Pickering Town, lost by the same scoreline at Eccleshill United to fall five points behind with a game in hand.

Jarrold Peltier grabbed the vital goal with five minutes remaining.

Fifth-placed Hallam were unable to close the gap on the top four as they were beaten 3-1 at home by Brodsworth Welfare.

James Tevendale had put them ahead on four minutes before Darren Fell and Liam Wilkins moved Welfare in front by the interval.

Wilkins grabbed his second and Brodsworth's third soon after the break to continue their recent resurgence.

In Division One, two promotion-chasing sides kept themselves within a good chance of claiming second place.

Bottesford Town moved up to third, a point behind current tenants Rainworth Miners Welfare with a game in hand, after a 4-1 victory at AFC Emley.

Two goals from James Hare and one each from Phil Jackman and Paul Chatterton gave them a clear advantage before a late Kyle Hawthorne penalty allowed the hosts some cheer.

And, Scarborough Athletic are still determined to have a say after they claimed the biggest League victory of the season with an 8-0 annihilation of Borrowwash Victoria.

Scott Phillips, Mark Griffin and Liam Widdowson had them 3-0 up by half-time before putting the Vics to the sword in the final 25 minutes of the game.

Gary Hepples and Craig Hogg added to the scoreline before a hat-trick in the last quarter-of-an-hour by Ryan Blott completed the rout.

The Wilkinson Sword Trophy Final remains tantalisingly poised after the first leg in midweek.

It was an even encounter at Camarvon Street as Teversal and Hall Road Rangers played out a 1-1 draw.

Danny Tighe put the hosts ahead on 32 minutes before David Ingram levelled matters for Rangers with seventeen minutes remaining.

The second leg takes place at Dene Park on the 2nd of April.

Meanwhile, in the League, Winterton Rangers' seemingly relentless charge to the Premier Division title continued with a 4-1 win at Mickleover Sports.

They had gone behind through a 10th minute Mark Finlay strike before Rob Northen and David Watson gave them a half-time lead.

Watson added his second and Rangers' third on the hour mark before Andy Holt completed the scoring on 74 minutes.

That win increased their lead at the top of the table to fifteen points.

Liversedge remained in third place, almost mathematically out of the title race, as they were held 1-1 at home to Shirebrook Town.

Both goals came within a five minute spell around the half-hour mark as Daniel Cooper put Sedge ahead before Craig Cantrell claimed a point for the visitors.

The point eased Shirebrook's relegation fears a little as they moved up into fifteenth, four points away from the bottom two.

A 1-0 home win over Nostell Miners Welfare saw fourth-placed Pickering Town close the gap between themselves and the sides immediately above them, Richard Whitfield's 51st minute strike settling the encounter.

An Andy Howland second-half brace claimed a 2-0 win for Eccleshill United at Arnold Town in the battle of the Eagles.

Rob Cam and Scott Bates claimed a victory by the same scoreline for Hallam at home to Long Eaton United.

Rainworth Miners Welfare tightened their grip on second place in Division One with a 2-0 win at Leeds Met Carnegie.

Robbie Clarke broke the deadlock on 29 minutes before Danny Bainbridge doubled their advantage in first-half injury time.

They moved four points clear of third-placed Gedling Town who were held 2-2 at Worsbrough Bridge Athletic after taking a two goal lead.
