## Premier Division Crown Goes To Winterton

**Congratulations to Winterton Rangers whose emphatic 4-1 win at Brodsworth Welfare finally gave them the Premier Division title.**

# MATCH REVIEW

They were 3-1 victors at home to fifth-placed Hallam to increase the gap to third to three points.

All four goals came in a twelve minute spell towards the end of the first half in a game that saw both sides reduced to ten men.

Jonathan Pickess broke the deadlock on 31 minutes before Michael Fox added a second soon after.

The deficit was immediately halved through James Tevendale before Fox grabbed his second and Glapwell's third on 43.

Gavin Hunter was red carded for Hallam after a tussle with Matt Varley whilst Pickess was also given his marching orders for two bookable offences.

Liversedge moved up into third with a 3-0 win at home to Long Eaton United. Nicky Boshell's brace, including an 88th minute penalty, and Brook Newton's strike on the half-hour set up the straightforward win.

Sedge climbed over Pickering Town who were held 0-0 at Armthorpe Welfare.

The battle to avoid being in the bottom two with basement side Glasshoughton Welfare also reached a frenzy with three points separating the five sides involved.

Shirebrook Town and South Normanton Athletic made moves up the table with vital victories.

Shirebrook climbed to fifteenth with a 2-0 win at Glasshoughton with goals from Adam Yates and Jamie Smith.

And, a Lee Sutton double moved South Normanton out of the bottom two as they won 2-1 at home to Mickleover Sports with Dave Middleditch getting the visitors' consolation.

They were replaced by Lincoln Moorlands Railway who lost 1-0 at home to Nostell Miners Welfare.

Neil Beardsmore struck on the stroke of full-time to give the away side all three points.

And, Thackley dropped to sixteenth as they were comprehensively beaten 4-1 at Parkgate.

Caine Cheetham and Matt Roney had put the hosts two-up before Ian Horrocks pulled one back for Thackley.

But, second half goals from Gavin Allott and Roney made sure of the victory.

All the action in the 1-1 draw between Arnold Town and Selby Town came in the first fifteen minutes.

The Eagles, playing their last game at Gedling Road before the summer move to their new ground, went ahead through Craig Mitchell.

But, Steve Lyon made sure it was not a winning end to fifty years of football at the ground as he levelled matters for Selby.

Hall Road Rangers are now overwhelming favourites to take second spot in Division One after a commanding 5-1 home win over AFC Emley.

With two games to play, they moved five points clear of Rainworth Miners Welfare whose game was called off.

Goals from Martin Thacker, Andrew Haywood, Jamie Barnwell and two from Paul Palmer, with one from the penalty spot, secured the victory.

Lee Hill got the consolation, also a spot kick, for Emley.

With Hall Road and Rainworth still to face each other, fourth-placed Bottesford Town could still have an outside chance of finishing second despite being held to a 4-4 draw at Teversal.

The first-half at Camarvon Street was a remarkable affair with seven goals coming before the interval.

Phil Cutler and John Baross had put Bottesford two goals ahead in the opening fourteen minutes before Steven Edwards dragged one back for Teversal.

Two goals for Steve Harrod around the half-hour mark gave the away side a seemingly unassailable 4-1 lead.

But, Jamie Hudson and a second from Edwards brought it back to a one-goal lead before the break.

And, Marc Scott grabbed the equaliser with fifteen minutes remaining, making it a vital two points dropped by the visitors.

Champions Dinnington Town, meanwhile, kept their eleven point gap at the top of the table with a 4-2 win at Borrowash Victoria.

Two goals from Ant Lynam, making it 42 in all competitions for the Dinnington frontman, plus one each from Grant Allott and Michael Blythen earned them the victory.

Phil Summerfield and Rob Spencer found the back of the net for the Vics.

Scarborough Athletic stayed fifth with a 2-1 win at bottom side Pontefract Collieries with early goals from Scott Phillips and Ryan Blott.

The only movement in the table came with Yorkshire Amateur's 2-0 win at Tadcaster Albion thanks to late goals from Dempsey Smith and Scott Smith.

The Ammas climbed one place to fourteenth with that win.

Meanwhile, Leeds Met Carnegie and Gedling Town were 2-1 home winners over Worsbrough Bridge Athletic and Rossington Main, respectively.

# IN THE MEDIA

The visitors formed a guard of honour for the Arnold team as they emerged from the changing rooms.

Former players of Arnold FC, Arnold Kingswell, Arnold St Mary's and Arnold Town attended the game for free.

The first league game at Gedling Road took place over fifty years ago on the 1st of September, 1956.

Arnold Town were formed in 1989 following a merger between the old established Arnold FC and Arnold Kingswell.

As the club leave Gedling Road, there will be many fond memories for supporters – young and old.

The club's finest achievements there include two appearances in the FA Cup First Round.

In 1967-68, they were defeated by Bristol Rovers in front of a crowd of 3,390 at Gedling Road and, in 1977-78, Port Vale were the victors but only after a replay.

Another key event in the history of the ground was the record 10-1 victory over Denaby United in October 1994 – Chris Freestone scoring an incredible seven times.

The club are due to move to Eagle Valley in August and the

complex will play host to the clubs 32 teams and will provide changing rooms, a club house as well as five full size, three junior and two mini grass pitches.

## International Duty For NCEL Duo?

# MATCH REVIEW

Rangers now only need three points from their remaining six matches to be confirmed as Premier Division champions.

That's because the only other side along with Glapwell who are able to catch them, Pickering Town, were also beaten.

They lost 1-0 at home to a Simon Hore strike in the final minute to give Arnold Town the points.

Pickering remained in fifth, two points behind Hallam who picked up a 3-3 draw at home to Armthorpe Welfare.

They had to come from behind three times to get the point – Andrew Brownrigg, Richard Carrington and James Tevendale all equalising after Gary Jones, Danny Sharpe and then Stuart Preston had given Welfare the lead.

Selby Town stayed sixth after a goalless draw at home to Mickleover Sports.

The battle for second place in Division One is down to three teams with only one point separating them.

Rainworth Miners Welfare stayed in second despite only drawing 1-1 at Tadcaster Albion.

Malc Brown grabbed them an equaliser in the 77th minute after Nick Lawrie had put the hosts ahead.

Bottesford Town and Hall Road Rangers took advantage and claimed victories to close the gap.

Third-placed Bottesford won 1-0 at Leeds Met Carnegie thanks to an 11th minute goal from Craig Lill.

Andrew Haywood and Jamie Barnwell were the scorers in a 2-0 victory at Teversal.

The home side's misery was compounded with goalkeeper Jonathan Wilson taken to hospital with what was later confirmed as a double fracture in his right ankle. All at the NCEL wish him a speedy recovery.

Rossington Main's 3-1 victory at home to Yorkshire Amateur confirmed Pontefract Collieries as the bottom side in Division One.

Goals from Andrew Culshaw and Nathan Hill with a penalty from William McGhie gave Main the points, Dempsey Smith grabbed the consolation for the visitors.

Barton Town Old Boys won 2-1 at home to AFC Emley.

Champions Dinnington Town were in party mood at Scarborough Athletic on Sunday and the spoils were shared in front of 539 spectators with a 1-1 draw.

Richard Medcalf had put the Seadogs ahead midway through the first half before Grant Allott levelled in the opening minutes of the second period.

## (Round 69 – Tue 8th Apr)

Liversedge are this season's Presidents Cup winners after a thrilling extra-time victory at Armthorpe Welfare.

Going into the game tied at 1-1 from the first leg, it was the hosts who struck first with Gary Jones finding the net after just sixteen minutes.

Sedge levelled, however, after a penalty was awarded for handball just before the break that Nicky Boshell coolly converted.

That is how it stayed until extra-time when a double salvo in the opening five minutes of the first period sealed the tie.

Luke Sherman and Andy Markham made sure of the victory, 3-1 on the night and 4-2 on aggregate, that saw Liversedge lift the trophy for the first time.

Meanwhile, the race for second place in both the Premier Division and Division One took another intriguing twist.

A last minute penalty by Joe Connor gave Pickering Town a 2-1 win at home to Eccleshill United.

The Pikes had gone behind to a Marcus Edwards strike on 52 minutes but they quickly cancelled that out through Richard Whitfield before the late drama saw them snatch the victory.

It moved them up into third spot, two points behind second-placed Glapwell with a game in hand.

Hall Road Rangers, meanwhile, are now favourites to take runners-up spot in Division One after their 2-1 win at bottom side Pontefract Collieries.

That moved them above rivals Rainworth Miners Welfare and Bottesford Town into second.

Andrew Haywood and Paul Palmer gave them a comfortable two-goal cushion before Ponte grabbed a late consolation by Andrew Lanes.

## (Round 70 – Sat 12th Apr)

Winterton Rangers confirmed what many had been expected for several weeks as they claimed the Premier Division crown.

Needing three points to be uncatchable, any early nerves at Brodsworth Welfare were quickly extinguished as a double strike in the opening four minutes from Andy Holt put Rangers well on their way.

Holt then grabbed his and Winterton's third on 47 minutes before Sean Gorman pulled one back for the hosts soon after.

David Ricardo's goal four minutes from time sealed the 4-1 victory to pick up their first Premier Division title.

Glapwell stayed fourteen points behind in second place with a win that boosted their chances of promotion to the UniBond League.

# MATCH REVIEW

## (Round 67 – Tue 1st Apr to Wed 2nd Apr)

**An extra-time strike by Jamie Barnwell saw Hall Road Rangers pick up the Wilkinson Sword Trophy in a dramatic Final.**

After the first game finished 1-1, Teversal were just seventeen minutes away from victory after Jamie Hudson had given them the lead on the half-hour at Dene Park.

Rangers were then awarded a penalty that was converted by Paul Palmer and, with nine minutes remaining of extra-time, Barnwell made himself the hero.

The hosts won 2-1 on the night, 3-2 on aggregate, and Hall Road lifted the trophy for the second time in five years.

Meanwhile, the Presidents Cup Final is finely balanced after a 1-1 draw in the first leg between Liversedge and Armthorpe Welfare.

The two sides meet in the reverse fixture at Church Street next Tuesday.
