League Announces Sponsorship Deal

"There are two people I must mention and say thank you to, David Morrall of the Northern Counties East League and Export Manager for KoolSport, Robert Healey. Without their help, this sponsorship would not have happened."

They now want to expand into the UK market and see the Northern Counties East League and its member clubs as an effective method of gaining exposure for the KoolSport brand.

A meeting will be arranged for all member clubs to attend to discuss the logistics of this sponsorship in early July along with League administration for season 2008/09.

Six New Clubs For NCEL

It has been confirmed that six new clubs have been accepted into the KoolSport Northern Counties East League, subject to approval at the AGM.

The FA have accepted the proposals that will mean that both Divisions in the League will include twenty teams.

Bridlington Town come down from the UniBond League where they will be replaced by Premier Division runners-up, Glapwell.

Three clubs will be coming in from the Central Midlands League, champions Askern Welfare as well as Appleby Frodingham and Grimsby Borough.

And, Brighouse Town and Hemsworth Miners Welfare will be joining us from the West Riding County Amateur League.

Two teams will be leaving us - Division One sides Borrowwash Victoria and Gedling Town - to join the new Step 6 East Midlands League.

Dinnington Town and Hall Road Rangers have been promoted from Division One and will play in the Premier Division next season.

Lincoln Moorlands Railway and Glasshoughton Welfare ended in the relegation places in the Premier Division but whether either, neither or both of them go down is still subject to confirmation..

The NCEL would like to wish all our teams, including those who are leaving us, all the very best in the future.

All proposals will need to be ratified at the League's Annual General Meeting that takes place on Saturday the 21st of June.

Points Deduction For Brodsworth

NCEL Premier Division side Brodsworth Welfare have been deducted two points with immediate effect.

They were found to have fielded players in two matches who should have been sidelined due to County FA suspension.

The first player was involved in the 3-3 draw at home to Armthorpe Welfare on Boxing Day.

Then, a different player took part in the 2-2 draw at Maltby Main on January 19th.

The points deduction does not affect the Premier Division table's final positions as Brodsworth still end the season in thirteenth place.

But, they have now totalled 45 points.

"There are some good people at Moorlands and I have gained respect for Darren Dye, the Manager, who has had to battle away all season with his hands tied firmly behind his back.

"The players have remained loyal to him throughout which says a lot when many expected them to jump ship when the expenses stopped.

"I wish the Club all the best for the future."

MATCH REVIEW

(Round 75 – Mon 28th Apr to Tue 29th Apr)

Glapwell were assured second place in the Premier Division and promotion to the UniBond League in midweek without even playing.

Pickering Town's 1-0 defeat at home to Parkgate meant that the Hall Corner side could not be caught.

Richard Patterson's strike in first-half injury time was the moment that confirmed that the Derbyshire side were going up to Step 4 in the National League System for the first time ever.

Bottesford Town were unable to keep the Lincolnshire Senior Trophy in NCEL hands as they were beaten 2-0 by United Counties League side, Blackstones.

Their top scorer Phil Stebbing grabbed both goals in the Final that took place at Sleaford Town's ground to take the crown won by Lincoln Moorlands last season.

The NCEL Division One season drew to a close with the final two games played.

Leeds Met Carnegie ended the campaign in style with a 5-0 win at home to Tadcaster Albion.

Kev Ryan and Alex O'Brien both claimed two goals each before Simon Armstrong found the back of the net with four minutes remaining.

And, it was a point each at The Euronics Ground as Barton Town Old Boys and Rainworth Miners Welfare played out a 1-1 draw.

Gary Dickinson put the hosts ahead on 32 minutes before Sam Betts levelled matters for the Wrens early in the second period.

(Round 75 – Sat 3rd May to Mon 5th May)

Winterton Rangers became the seventh side to complete the double in the NCEL with a 3-1 win over Parkgate in the League Cup Final.

Peter Daniel's side join Shepshed Charterhouse, Guiseley, North Shields, Spennymoor United, Hucknall Town and Alfreton Town in lifting both the Premier Division title and the League Cup in the same season.

Andy Holt gave them the lead in first-half injury time and then doubled their advantage in the 49th minute at Staveley Miners Welfare's Inkersall Road ground.

Gavin Allott pulled one back for Parkgate on 55 from the penalty spot but they could not get back level.

And, Danny Clarke converted a spot-kick of his own in the dying moments to claim victory for the Lincolnshire side.

Two days earlier, they had ensured they were Premier Division champions by thirteen points with a 2-0 win at Thackley.

David Ricardo and Rob Northen grabbed the goals to take them over the 90 point barrier.

Michael Fox's 36th-minute strike saw second placed Glapwell also end the season on a high with a 1-0 victory at home to Lincoln Moorlands Railway.

It is expected that the Hall Corner side will now be promoted to the UniBond League whilst Moorlands, who finish in the bottom two, have a nervy wait to see if they are reprieved from relegation.

Brodsworth Welfare's excellent second half of the season came to an end with a 3-1 win at home to Long Eaton United.

All the goals came in the second period with Sean Gorman and Darren Fell putting the hosts well ahead before an 85th minute Mark Strzyzewski strike pulled Long Eaton back into the game.

However, Jake Stanard made sure of the victory soon after.

South Normanton Athletic ended the season with a four match winning streak that moved them up to seventeenth in the table.

Lee Sutton and Ian Wheat grabbed the goals on their final day 2-0 victory at Nostell Miners Welfare.

Selby Town finished their campaign in seventh with a 1-0 win at home to Parkgate, Brenton Leister with the goal six minutes from time.

And, Shirebrook Town ended in fifteenth as a 2-1 home victory over Liversedge made it five matches unbeaten for the Langwith Road side.

A Jamie Smith strike and a Dean Short penalty put them two-up before Kieran Corley claimed an injury-time consolation.
