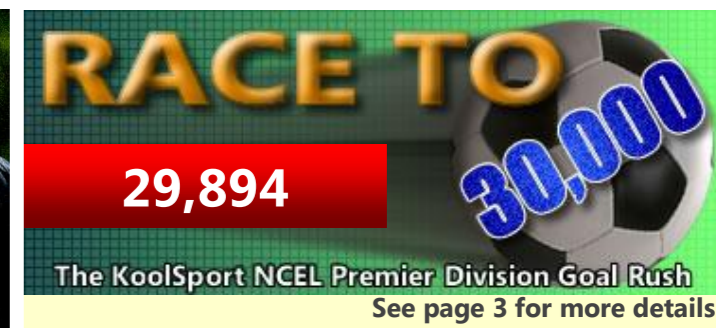

Respect

RESPECT COMES IN FROM NOVEMBER 1ST

All KoolSport Northern Counties East League clubs attended a meeting last week to learn more about the Football Association's Respect campaign.

The League have now formally signed up to the scheme and is totally committed to implementing it into its games and general culture of the League and its member clubs.

Representatives from all the League's 39 teams were at Parkgate FC to hear more about the programme and to learn of their responsibilities within it.

It was launched by the FA during the Summer to try and bring back respect to match officials from players, managers and spectators.

It also increases the role of the team captains in achieving that.

The behaviour of those in the dugouts will also be under the spotlight in a bid to cut down threatening and foul-and-abusive language.


A presentation about the programme was given during the evening and a Respect pack was handed to each club.

A similar meeting involving the League's referees, outlining their role in the initiative, takes place at Worsbrough Bridge Athletic's ground on Thursday.

Then, the Respect campaign will kick into full swing from the 1st of November.


POINTS DOCKED FROM TWO PREMIER CLUBS

The following point deductions have come into force in the KoolSport NCEL Premier Division.



Liversedge have been fined £200 and docked three points for playing two unregistered players in their 4-0 home win against Dinnington Town on Saturday 9th August.

The time to lodge an appeal against the decision has run out.



Maltby Main have been fined £100 and had three points deducted for playing an unregistered player in their 6-3 home win against Eccleshill United on Saturday 30th August.

Main accepted the League's Management Board's decision.

Boro Honour For Football Legends

Four legends of Scarborough football are to become honorary members of the town's KoolSport NCEL Division One side.

Scarborough Athletic are keen to honour the quartet who, when connected with Scarborough FC, brought the former club huge success.

Jeff Barmby, Colin Appleton, Harry Dunn and Neil Warnock have all said they are delighted to accept the honour from the Seadogs.

Barmby was a striker who signed for Boro from Goole Town in 1969. He went on to become a fans favourite, scoring 156 goals in just over 300 matches in an eight-year spell.

Appleton, a left-half, made his Boro debut back in the 1951-52 season as a 16-year-old.

He left Boro to enjoy a successful career at Leicester City - including two FA Cup finals - but came back to Scarborough in the early 70s to take a player-coach role.

Defender Harry Dunn holds the appearance record for Scarborough FC, having played in more than 900 matches between 1963 and 1983.

And, Neil Warnock will always be known as the manager who took Boro into the Football League in 1987.

Although the honour gives the member no share or voting privileges, each honorary life member will receive free entry to matches with hospitality, a certificate and, when the club returns to play in Scarborough, and recognition on an engraved plaque in the clubhouse.

Meanwhile, Simon Cope, chair of Scarborough Athletic, has been awarded the Richard Lillicrap Award at the annual national conference of Supporters' Direct.

The government backed group are the umbrella organisation of all supporters Trusts and supporter-owned football clubs.

The conference, held at the QEII Centre in London, was attended by FA chairman Lord Triesman, who was the event's keynote speaker, and Andy Burnham, Secretary of State for Culture Media & Sport, and former chair of Supporters' Direct.

Cope's award is in recognition of his continuing commitment and effort in forwarding the Supporters Trust movement, and is named after a former Supporters' Direct and Swansea City Trust board member.

Cope, who was nominated by his fellow board members for the award, said: "This award has come as a complete surprise to me, and I am immensely proud for our work here at Boro to be recognised by the wider Supporters' Trust community.

"It is a testament not just to my work but to all those who have helped in the creation of the Trust and subsequently Scarborough Athletic FC."
