## Mickleover Sports Crowned as NCEL Champs

**Congratulations to Mickleover Sports who have been confirmed as the champions of the KoolSport NCEL Premier Division.**

The Station Road side had led the table for much of the season but had to wait until their final game to confirm their title triumph.

A 4-2 win at home on Saturday to the only side that could deny them the championship, Long Eaton United, secured top spot and promotion to the UniBond League.

It ends ten years of NCEL football for Mickleover after they joined from the Central Midlands League in 1999.

All at the League wish them the best at their new level and we hope they can be as successful as many of our teams who have made the move up.

Elsewhere, Rainworth Miners Welfare confirmed their move up into the Premier Division with a 3-0 victory the previous weekend at Worsbrough Bridge Athletic.

The Wrens go up alongside Division One champions, Scarborough Athletic.

Boss Rudy Funk said: He said: "This is a magnificent dream come true ... four years, two promotions and I don't think our ultimate target of the UniBond League will be very far away for us next season.

"But let's concentrate on what has happened, on another momentous day in the great history of a great football club.

"For me personally it is a little bit emotional. I am a continental, and maybe we are a little more inclined to be that way than are the British, so my emotions run very high.

"And I'm very emotional today for the simple reason that this is about Rainworth people, the people who have always dreamed that Rainworth Football Club could go places. And my belief is that this club really is going places."
