## Match Review #1 - 8th August, 2010

**Farsley AFC began life in the KoolSport Northern Counties East League in the most emphatic way possible with an 8-2 victory at Arnold Town.**

The Villagers were helped by the fact that their hosts were reduced to nine men during the game but they are already living up to their billing by many as pre-season favourites to take the title.

Gareth Grant and Dave Stead found the net twice each whilst there were also goals for Andy Cooper, Mark Jackson, Dominic Krief and Thomas Jackson.

Arnold's goals, both in a six-goal first half, came from Tremayne Walters and Tony Law.

Almost as emphatic were Armthorpe Welfare who continued their excellent form at the end of last season with a 5-0 home win to start this campaign.

Two up against Liversedge in the opening fifteen minutes with strikes from Craig Morley and Adam Watson, they built on their fine start with further goals from Craig Fletcher, Chris Dyson and Darren Mansaram in the second period.

Two of the other early favourites for the Premier Division crown both drew their opening fixtures.

Defending champions Bridlington Town came from behind, conceding an eleventh minute Joshua McClean goal, to draw 1-1 at Thackley as Wayne Wallace restored parity just before the interval.

And, a last minute equaliser from Scott Phillips saw Scarborough Athletic draw 2-2 at home to Lincoln Moorlands Railway.

Phillips had earlier scored the first goal of the Premier Division season with a fifth minute penalty before Tom Carrick and Ben Good netted for the visitors.

Division One champions Tadcaster Albion drew 3-3 at Parkgate, Mike Braithwaite grabbing a brace whilst Ashley Worsfold also found the net twice for the hosts in what was a scintillating game.

The other side joining Tadcaster in the top flight were Brighouse Town and their first Premier Division match was one for them to remember as they beat visitors Pickering Town, 3-0.

Nathan Cartman struck twice, once in each half, and Wayne Crossley made sure of the victory with six minutes remaining.

Dinnington Town were 2-1 winners at home to Hallam whilst Selby Town were victorious by the same scoreline over visitors Maltby Main.

Winterton Rangers picked up a 3-1 win at Hall Road Rangers whilst Long Eaton United and Nostell Miners Welfare played out a 1-1 draw at Grange Park.

Bottesford Town are the early leaders of Division One after they annihilated visitors Brodsworth Welfare, 7-1.

Mark Anderson and Jake Cawsey divided four between them whilst Craig Bridge, Carl La Rocca and Tom Finnigan also found the net.

Nathan Hall grabbed an 89th-minute consolation for Brodsworth but last season's poor form that saw them stranded at the bottom of the Premier Division threatens to continue.

The other relegated side, Shirebrook Town, fared far better as they won 5-3 at home to Appleby Frodingham with Simon Johnson scoring two.

Leeds Carnegie, who narrowly missed out on promotion last time round, started off with a 1-0 home victory over AFC Emley, Anthony Hilton with the goal eighteen minutes from time.

A Jamie Rowbotham brace started Louth Town's life off in the NCEL perfectly with a 3-1 win at home to Worsbrough Bridge Athletic.

There were also opening day victories for Barton Town Old Boys, Hemsworth Miners Welfare, Pontefract Collieries, Askern Villa and Staveley Miners Welfare.

He replaces Ian Banks who left by mutual consent after the club finished in eighth place last month.

Bland spent last season as assistant manager at UniBond League club Worksop Town but was keen to get back into the managers seat after previously holding that role at Maltby Main and Emley's league rivals, Staveley Miners Welfare.

Emley committee member Graeme Dodgson, who chaired the selection panel, was delighted with the appointment.

He said: "We had some excellent applicants for the post and, in the end, selected Darren from a very strong short-list of six.

"The club is delighted that Darren accepted the position and are confident that he is the man who can steer us to our ultimate goal of promotion to the NCEL Premier Division.

"Darren really impressed us with his appetite for success and his knowledge and experience of the game at our level."

## Wrens Promotion Confirmed

**The KoolSport NCEL would like to congratulate Rainworth Miners Welfare whose promotion to the Evo-Stik League has been confirmed by the FA today.**



The loudest cheer at their annual presentation night in the Welfare on Saturday night was heard when manager Rudy Funk announced he had been given special dispensation ahead of today's official release to tell the audience that the club had been officially promoted to Step 4 on the National League System.

Wrens players and officials had been sweating on the FA decision on the make-up of the leagues from Step 1 to 4, which had been due last Thursday but was deferred until today, with an embargo placed on the club not to release the information to the media ahead of the FA's own announcement.

The decision makes Rainworth the first ever Miners' Welfare club to reach Step 4, although other clubs at that level and above, including Hucknall Town and Frickley Athletic, are both former Colliery Welfare outfits.

Rainworth had finished second to Bridlington in their first season as a Step 5 club and, when the Seasiders announced that they would not accept promotion it became a case of 'wait and see' whether the Wrens would be allowed to make the expected step up in Bridlington's place.

Now that he knows his club will be competing in Division One South of the Evo-Stik (formerly UniBond) League, manager Funk can at last set his sights on competing at the next level, after leading the ambitious Wrens to their third promotion in four seasons.

"I'm absolutely ecstatic about it and just can't put into words how pleased I am," he said. "I'm delighted for the football club and the whole community that we will be seeing Northern Premier League football at Kirklington Road next season.

"Five years ago when Billy Millar and I arrived at Rainworth we promised to bring UniBond League football to the club, and that has now been achieved, so we must now look to our next target – because this is still not the limit of achievement for this club, and we have now surely surpassed even anything achieved by that great 1982 Wembley team.

"It's like a big fairy tale, that we will now be rubbing shoulders with massive clubs like Leek Town, Witton Albion and others, as well as Glapwell who will be our local derby rivals. This club has grown so big, so strong, that next season every game will be a big game.

"There are so many people, far too many to mention but from Billy Millar to everyone behind the scenes, people who have supported us financially and through the gates, who have all played their part and done so much to bring us to the level which we have now attained, and to make the club what it has become.

"We are not a rich club, but we have a massive heart

and that will stand us in good stead for the new challenge.

"People laughed at me when I set our initial target of reaching this level, and they may well laugh again when I mention the word 'Conference', but I genuinely believe that is an achievable target in the years to come."

In the absence of chairman Derek Blow, vice-chairman Brian Reece added: "I'm thrilled that we have been promoted again, and trust that we will do justice to our new status.

"I also hope that we will attract more Rainworth people to our matches now we are at the higher level."
